

Embracing Difference Primary Workshops Overview

Our 'Embracing Difference' workshops aim to educate young people about diversity, encouraging them to develop empathy and respect, empowering students to model positive behaviours in school.

These workshops **support schools in delivering the RSHE curriculum** through exploring how others' families can look different but must be treated with respect. They also help students to understand the importance of respecting others and their differences, what it means to be an upstander, what a stereotype is, and how stereotypes can be unfair, negative or destructive.

They also promote students' Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural (SMSC) development, are aligned to anti-bullying best practice as laid out in Preventing and Tackling Bullying (Department for Education, 2017), and support schools in meeting their legal obligations under the Equality Act 2010 by fostering good relations between diverse members of the school community.





Role Model Stories: Each workshop features a volunteer Role Model who shares a developmentally appropriate personal story around the importance of respecting differences, challenging stereotypes and celebrating different families. All role models are trained and supported in crafting their story to meet the needs of different age groups.
