Kieran shares his story of how he struggled to come to terms with the fact that he was gay due to the way people were treating him growing up. He talks about trying to change everything about himself so that he wouldn't be bullied.

Martin shares his experience of bullying throughout primary and secondary school. He talks about how this bullying started with name calling and being left out, which escalated as he got older. He shares how he didn't feel able to tell a trusted adult and the reasons for this and how this impacted his schooling.



Simon shares his personal story about how he struggled to come out as gay because he didn't feel he related to any of the stereotypes of gay men he saw in society. He discusses the impact this had on his life and how he found

the courage to come out after meeting his now husband.

Themes: Stereotyping, LGBTQ+ identities, coming out



Charlotte grew up not conforming to gender stereotypes from an early age, their favourite activity was football. As a teenager, they came out as gay, They left home at 19 and felt able to explore their identity. They discovered they are deaf and have celiac disease. Soon after they realised that they identify as non-binary.

This was something his parents didn't realise as they thought he was different due to his hearing loss and weren't initially aware of his intersectional identity.

Priscilla talks about the difficulties she experienced growing up being both a Christian and bisexual. Finding an inclusive church helped her to reconcile these two

aspects of her identity. Priscilla talks about other parts of her identity and how they intersect with each other. She talks about having a sense of pride in all of the parts that make her who she is and how she wants to instill this in her daughter.

Keith is Black and gay. He went to a school where the other students were all white. Keith felt he needed to hide his sexuality because he had been told it was wrong to be gay, and because he did not want to draw any additional attention to his family. When he was older, he found an accepting community and was able to embrace his own identity.

Melissa discusses how a lack of representation of people of colour growing up impacted her self esteem, and how she came to embrace her dual heritage. Having come to a point of self acceptance she later realised that she had suppressed another part of her identity; her sexuality. She discusses how she came to realise this later in life and how coming out felt for her.



Kate knew she was different from other boys from a young age, but struggled to tell people after experiencing

Being Bisexual - Rachel's Story



Rachel grew up with parents who were supportive of her and her brother's ambitions and goals. Rachel wanted to be a dancer and her brother, a musician. She expected to

leave school, follow her career, get married and have children as she thought this was the path she was expected to follow.

Her brother passed away and it affected her deeply, her grief making her want to break free of expectations. She channelled her energies into dance and left home to study it at university. At university she met a woman who she fell in love with, when up until then she had thought she was straight. She started to identify as bisexual and came out to her parents.

Being Non-Binary - Alix's Story

It put me in a box that I didn't want to be in.

-Alix's Story

Alix's story starts at 15 years old when they had an interest in cosplay and enjoyed portraying different characters. They realised that when they were portraying characters of a different gender they felt more comfortable in who they were.

They speak about attending Trans Pride and meeting people who they felt an affinity with. This helped them come to a realisation that they identified as non binary and wanted to start using they/them pronouns.

Richie's Story

Even my teachers made fun of me for being girly.

-Richie's Story

Richy shares his story of experiencing homophobic bullying whilst at school because he didn't conform to male gender stereotypes. He later reveals that he is straight and highlights that Homophobic, Biphobic and Transphobic (HBT) bullying can affect anyone. He points out that some of the bullying was from teachers as well as other pupils, showing that tackling HBT bullying needs a whole school focus.

Themes: Bullying, homophobia, gender stereotypes, prejudice language

Keith's Story

Liking myself properly for the first time in my life.

-Keith's Story

Keith described his experience growing up as the only black pupil at his primary school and how he discovered he was different in another way while at secondary school when he realised he was gay. The homophobic language he heard

around him in school led him to feel ashamed and scared to tell anyone about his sexuality. Eventually he came out to a friend, whose support and care helped him open up to others and be proud of who he is.






Love and acceptance have a place in religious belief.



They talk about finding their true self and the happiness and joy this brought them. Ben uses they/them pronouns and is non-binary.

Being Asexual - Yasmin's Story

People didn't believe me.

-Yasmin's Story

Yasmin talks about her experience discovering her asexuality and explains the difficulties she had in finding the language to express it. She highlights the lack of representation within schools and the media as a reason why her peers and teachers did not understand this part of her identity and that

this led to bullying. Yasmin also notes the barriers she faced as a black woman and the racist stereotypes attached to this.

Themes: LGBTQ+ identities, acephobia, racism, coming out

Being Bisexual - Kirsty's Story


It is important to have representation.

Kirsty is bisexual and discusses growing up being very assured of her sexuality. She mentions hearing negative language both inside and outside of school about samesex relationships. She also mentions how representation can

LGBTQ+ History/Activism - Emma's Story

I was hiding half of myself.

-Emma's Story

Emma experienced homophobic bullying in school.
Because of Section 28, her teachers were not able to support her. After joining the Royal Navy, Emma was 'outed' and discharged from her work. She initiated court proceedings against the UK government in the European Court of Human Rights, and won.

Themes: LGBTQ+ identities, institutional homophobia, Section 28, coming out


LGBTQ+ History/Activism - Ferhan's Story

Carole's Story



Carole shares her story of how she was severely bullied throughout primary school for her race, family background and appearance. Carole discusses how she wishes she had an ally in school.

Themes: Bullying, intersectionality, racism, mental health, allyship

Oliviette's Story

Be who you're meant to be.

-Oliviette's Story

Olivette talks about growing up as a Black Lesbian at a time when the LGBTQ+ community had fewer rights. She discusses being inspired by the events of the Stonewall Uprising in June of 1969 and Black feminist movements. She

talks about her experiences of intersectionality as a Black LGBTQ+ woman facing homophobia, sexism and racism at different points in particular ways. She also discusses her Christian faith. Olivette covers "coming out" or telling people around her that she is LGBTQ+.

Themes: Intersectionality, LGBTQ+ identities, homophobia, sexism, racism, coming out, faith (Christianity)

Being Non-Binary - Mon's Story

You can't tell someone's identity by looking at them.

Mon shares their experiences of how they did not fit gendered expectations growing up. They describe how important it is to have the language and terms to describe yourself and that how we label ourselves can change. They discuss how societal attitudes towards people who do not fit expected stereotypes can be negative and hurtful.

Being Non-Binary - Kim's Story

If you have a choice on how to treat someone, be kind.

-Kim's Story

Kim grew up knowing from an early age they did not fit into a category of 'boy' or 'girl'. They did not conform to the gender stereotypes expected of them by those around them. They experienced people constantly questioning their gender and faced bullying at school. They eventually came out as non binary and use they/them pronouns.

Themes: LGBTQ+ identities, coming out, bullying, stereotypes

Being Transgender - Holly's Story

I couldn't tell her, so I wrote her a letter.

-Holly's Story

Holly shares her story about coming out as a transgender woman and how she didn't get the support she needed to live as her true self until later in life. She describes coming out to her parents at 14 but then not talking about it again until much later. She eventually came out to her then girlfriend who supported her to come out to others in her life. She now lives in London and is married to her wife and is living the life she dreamed she'd be able to live.


Allyship - Jamie's Story

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
LGBTQ+ History - Barry's Story


All through my education it was illegal to be gay.

Barry shares his story of growing up when anti-LGBTQ+ laws created a challenging environment for him to be open about his identity as a gay man. He discusses the impact of the HIV/AIDS crisis on people who were important to him and highlights the positive impact of being in a workplace with a strong culture of LGBTQ+ inclusion and the creation of Turing's Law.

He talks about how he was married to a woman for over a decade and had two children with her and how he came out after their marriage ended. He shares the supportive reactions of his children and discusses how he went on a journey to reconcile two important parts of his

She discusses the things that helped her on her journey to discovering her true self and finally feeling liberated and happy.

Homophobia - Gubs' Story

Living two lives: dutiful Sikh boy and young out guy.

-Gubs' Story

Gubs discusses the homophobic bullying people faced at school for not conforming to gender stereotypes and the assumptions his family had that he would marry a woman and follow a certain course in life. He discusses the challenges he faced in coming out to his family and how he and his husband have now been accepted by his family.

Themes: LGBTQ+ identities, coming out, homophobic bullying, stereotypes, faith (Sikhism)

Transphobia - Vicky-Jane's Story

I realised that I wasn't living my true life.

-Vicky-Jane's Story

Vicky Jane explains how she felt different from an early age and did not fit the expectations others had of her. She was bullied because of this, both in school and the workplace. Her mental health suffered as a consequence of the bullying and also due to having to hide her identity. Vicky Jane ends by talking about coming out and how sharing that with anyone shows a great deal of trust in the person it is shared with.

Lenna's Story

If you have the opportunity, please stand up, it makes such a difference.

-Lenna's Story

Lenna describes how she loved playing football when she was growing up. At university she experienced a situation where she felt forced to come out as a lesbian. By standing up she helped another student gain comfort and confidence. Lenna then realised the power that standing up can have to support others as well as ourselves.

Themes: coming out, LGBTQ+ identities, homophobia, outing, standing up for others.

There was no one to tell me any different or to fight in my corner

-Thomas' Story

Thomas talks about growing up in a small town as a boy who didn't fit the rigid gender stereotypes expected of him and describes being bullied as a result. He left his hometown and went to another school where people acknowledged and accepted difference. He experienced no bullying there because of the positive culture and environment.


